Cookie Policy

This policy specifically explains how “PibyThree” (hereinafter referred to as "we", "us", "our", COMPANY in this policy.

We, our partners, and users of our services deploy cookies, as well as the options you as Data Principal (“means any identified or identifiable individual to whom personal data relates”) have to control them accordance with the Digital Personal Data Protection Act (DPDPA).

What are cookies?

Cookies are small pieces of data, stored in text files, that are stored on your computer or other device when websites are loaded in a browser to make the user’s experience more efficient. They ensure a consistent and efficient experience for visitors, and perform essential functions such as allowing users to register and remain logged in.

How we use cookies?

Our website uses cookies. We use cookies for a number of different purposes such as to personalise content and ads, to provide social media features and to analyse our traffic. Some cookies are necessary for technical reasons; some enable a personalized experience for both visitors and registered users; and some allow the display of advertising from selected third party networks.

We will only store cookies on your device without prior consent if they are strictly necessary for the operation of this website. For all other types of cookies (including analytics and marketing), we require your explicit, affirmative consent before they are deployed to your device.

Where we place cookies?

We set cookies in a number of different locations across our services. These include:

- On our websites
- In the administrative dashboards of our websites
- On sites we host for our users.
- On sites that use our plugins
- In the emails we send.

This site uses different types of cookies. Some cookies are placed by third party services that appear on our pages.

Categories of Cookies

The table below explains the categories of cookies we use on our websites and why we use them.

Category of cookies	Why we use these cookies
Strictly Necessary Cookies	These cookies are essential for our websites and services to perform basic functions and are necessary for us to operate certain features. We use session cookies to maintain a user's session state across page requests, ensuring a seamless experience while navigating our website; these cookies are temporary and expire once the user logs off or closes the browser. These do not require consent.
Analytics and Performance	These cookies allow us to optimize performance by collecting information on how users interact with our websites, including which pages are visited most, as well as other analytical data. We use these details to improve how our websites function and to understand how users interact with them. These require your explicit opt-in consent.

First-Party and Third-Party Cookies

First-Party Cookies

First-party cookies are placed directly by our website and are generally used to provide core website functionality.

Current first-party cookie:

- PHPSESSID

Third-Party Cookies

Third-party cookies are placed by external service providers whose services are integrated into our website.

Current third-party cookies include:

- Google Analytics (_ga)
- Google Analytics (_ga_TYP2KVQ47H)

These third-party providers may process certain information in accordance with their own privacy policies.

Third-Party Services

Our website currently uses Google Analytics to understand how visitors interact with our website.

Google Analytics collects aggregated information relating to website usage, including:

- pages visited;
- browser type and version;
- operating system;
- approximate geographic location;
- device information;
- IP address (or truncated IP where configured);
- Device information;
- Date and time of visit;
- Session duration;
- Clickstream data;
- Approximate geographic location;
- Website interactions and events.

Google Analytics is provided by Google. Information collected through Google Analytics may be processed by Google in accordance with its applicable privacy practices. We encourage you to review Google's Privacy Policy and information regarding the use of Google Analytics for additional details.

In addition, people and companies that use our services to publish or host their own sites may place additional cookies. We provide more information on these cookies below.

Necessary (1)

Necessary cookies help make a website usable by enabling basic functions like page navigation and access to secure areas of the website. The website cannot function properly without these cookies.

PHPSESSID	pibythree.com	First Party	Session	Cookie generated by applications based on the PHP language. This is a general purpose identifier used to maintain user session variables. It is normally a random generated number, how it is used can be specific to the site, but a good example is maintaining a logged-in status for a user between pages.

Analytics and Performance (2)

Performance cookies are used to understand and analyse the key performance indexes of the website which helps in delivering a better user experience for the visitors.

_ga	Google Analytics	Third Party	1 year 1 month	This cookie name is associated with Google Universal Analytics - which is a significant update to Google's more commonly used analytics service. This cookie is used to distinguish unique users by assigning a randomly generated number as a client

				identifier. It is included in each page request in a site and used to calculate visitor, session and campaign data for the sites analytics reports.
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Analytics cookies are placed on your device only after you provide your consent through our Cookie Consent Banner. You may accept, reject, or customise your cookie preferences and may withdraw your consent at any time through the Cookie Preferences option available on our website.

Embedded Content

Our website may include content provided by third parties, such as videos, maps, social media widgets, or other embedded features. These third-party services may use cookies or similar technologies to collect information about your interaction with the embedded content, including your IP address, browser information, device information, and browsing activity.

Where such technologies are not strictly necessary for the operation of the website, they will only be activated after you have provided your consent through our cookie preference centre.

Live Chatbot Cookies

We may use cookies and similar technologies to enable our live chat or chatbot functionality. These technologies help maintain your chat session, remember your preferences during the conversation, improve customer support, and enhance the performance of our support services.

Information collected may include your chat session identifier, device information, browser type, IP address, and information you voluntarily provide during the conversation.

Cookies that are necessary to provide the chat service may be used without requiring additional consent where permitted by applicable law. Any optional analytics or performance cookies associated with the chat service will only be used with your consent.

How can you refuse or withdraw your consent to the use of cookies?

Under the DPDPA, you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time, and withdrawing consent is just as easy as giving it.

If you do not want cookies to be placed on your device, we suggest you to set your preferences regarding Cookies. By clicking "Cookie Preferences" on the bottom of each webpage, you can select the types of Cookies our website uses. You can change your preferences at any time; you can also withdraw the consent you have previously given to us.

If you wish to remove previously-stored cookies, you can manually delete the cookies at any time from your browser settings. However, this will not prevent our Site from placing further Cookies on your device unless and until you adjust your "Cookie Preferences" choice.

The steps below outline the general procedure for some of the most popular browsers.

CHROME

1. On your computer, open Chrome.
2. At the top left, select the Chrome menu and then Preferences.

3. At the bottom, select Advanced.
4. Under "Privacy and security," choose Content settings.
5. Click Cookies.
6. In the Cookies section, make desired changes to cookies settings such as:
 - Delete cookies
 - Block cookies by default
 - Allow cookies by default
 - Keep cookies and site data by default until you quit your browser
 - Make exceptions for cookies from specific websites or domains

MOZILLA FIREFOX

1. On your computer, open Firefox.
2. At the top left, select the Firefox menu and choose Preferences.
3. Under the "Privacy & Security", choose Cookies.
4. You can select the following settings:
 - Disable cookies
 - Enable cookies for the originating website only
 - Enable all cookies
 - Warn me before storing a cookie

INTERNET EXPLORER/EDGE

1. On your computer, open Internet Explorer.
2. Tap or click Tools, then select Internet options.
3. Tap or click the Privacy tab.
4. Under Settings, move the slider to the top to block all cookies or the bottom to allow all cookies.
5. Tap or click OK.

SAFARI

1. On your computer, open Safari.
2. Tap or select Preferences.
3. Select Privacy.
4. In the Block cookies section, specify if and when Safari should accept cookies from websites.
5. To see an explanation of the options, select the Help button (question mark).

Note: If you want to see which websites store cookies on your computer, select the Manage Website Data button.

If you set Safari to block cookies, you may need to temporarily accept cookies to open a page. Repeat the above steps, selecting Never. When you're done with the page, block cookies again, and then remove the page's cookies.
